GLOBAL GRANTS – Guiding Principles

- Intended for larger global projects minimum \$30,000 US budget
- Must align with an area of focus
- Must respond to a community need
- Must have long-term, SUSTAINABLE benefits with measurable results





GLOBAL GRANTS – Basic Requirements

- Requires a HOST Club in the project country
- Requires an International SPONSOR Club in another country
- Requires active Host community and Rotarian participation – Community Needs Assessment
- Must strengthen local knowledge, skills and resources





GLOBAL GRANTS – Administration

- Administered by The Rotary Foundation.
- Due Diligence is rigorously applied in grant evaluation, approval and reporting.
- Demand for Global Grants is greater than World Funds available.





GLOBAL GRANT – Financing Sources

- Sponsor Club(s) & District (s)
- District(s) Designated Funds Global
- Rotary Foundation Matching Funds
 - TRF matches 80% of DDF, Maximum \$400,000, No minimum
- Cash Contributions Rotarian & Non Rotarian
- Directed Gifts and Endowment Earnings
- Refer to "A Guide to Global Grants"





GLOBAL GRANT – Funding Example

Here is an example of the standard matching formula for Global Grants:

- Club (s) put up \$10,715 US (fund raising & cash contributions)
- District 5040 Global DDF matches 1/1 = \$10,715
- TRF matches District Designated Funds .8/1 = \$8,572

Grant Grand Total = \$30,000 US (Minimum for a Global Grant Project)

District 5040 matches to a maximum of \$20,000 for a given project.





GLOBAL GRANT – Global Grant DDF

- Available Global Grant DDF is retained by TRF
- TRF Reserves Funds for Submitted Applications
- TRF Releases Funds for Approved Applications
 - Approved Global Projects
 - Foundation Programs
- Unallocated Funds roll over to following year

GLOBAL GRANT – Application & Life Cycle

- My Rotary "Grant Center" Online Process
- Life Cycle
 - District confirms club is Qualified
 - Draft Project Concept in Detail
 - Authorization Club and District Review
 - Submitted Application to The Rotary Foundation
 - Approved Funds Issued
 - Implement, Monitor, Evaluate
 - Completion Annual Progress and Completion Reporting, Closure





GLOBAL GRANT – District 5040 Approved Projects

- Three Global Grant Approved Projects
 - New Westminster \$130,000 Disease Prevention & Treatment Uganda
 - West Vancouver Sunrise \$63,500 Water Sanitation & Hygiene
 - Uganda
 - Richmond Sunset \$124,000 Disease Prevention & Treatment
 - China
